

# Commission of Education

- Central educational authority in Poland
- Established in 1773
- Goal was to rebuild the education system
- By the last king of Poland, Stanisław August Poniatowski
- First educational authority in Poland and throughout Europe
- With the character of a modern ministry of public education.

# China



- Mathematics is considered the most important area of study
- Lots of attention is paid to the study of various philosophical concepts and logic
  - According to Chinese teachers, this is the key to understanding any phenomenon or problem.
- They do not pay as much attention to technology as other nations



# Africa

- There are countries with illiteracy rates above 50% among youth
- South Sahara has the highest rate of education
  - only  $\frac{1}{5}$  of children between ages 6 - 11 are not in school.
- Across the region 9 million girls age 6-11 will never go to school at all
- The exclusion rate for girls in adolescence is 36% and 32% for boys



# Europe



- More than 40% of people aged 25-34 has finished tertiary education
- More than 84% of people aged 20-24 have finished secondary education
- Best school systems in the world, in Scandinavia



# Afghanistan

- 3.7 million children are out-of-school, 60% of them are girls.
- Education for women is banned so they learn in “secret schools”
- Most kids don’t finish primary school

# Canada



- Most educated country in the world
- Literacy rate of 99%
- Free education until the end of secondary school
- High quality and accessibility of education
